Special Warrant for one acre granted out of the
Land Office of Maryland to John P. Bruns of
Baltimore City, bearing date the tenth day of September
Nineteen hundred and eight as appears.

I certify as Surveyor of Anne Arundel County,
that I have carefully surveyed for and in the name
of the said John P. Bruns all that piece or parcel
of land lying on both sides of Light Street Bridge,
being an Island in the Patapsco River in the
County of aforesaid.

on the East side of Light Street Bridge distant from
the bulkhead thereof twenty four and two thirds
perches, thence North thirty one degree East Eleven
