Whereas, John P. Bruns,

of Baltimore City ~~City~~ did set forth

that there was about the quantity of one

Acre^s of Vacant Land, lying in Anne Arundel

County, being an Island in the Patapsco River,

lying on both sides of Light Street Bridge,

partly cultivated, by means whereof the same could not be affected by a Common Warrant; he therefore required a Special Warrant to affect and secure it and that on return of a Certificate of Survey thereof, he complying with all other requisites according to law, may obtain a grant thereon, he having returned to the Commissioner of the Land Office an unexecuted Special Warrant for same quantity, bearing date the sixteenth day of September, 1907, as evidence of the payment of caution for the same.

Lay Out, Therefore, and Carefully Survey, for and in the name of the said John P. Bruns

the aforesaid one Acre^s of Vacant Land, be the same cultivated or otherwise, not running your lines within the lines of any former or more ancient survey, and return your Certificate of Survey thereof, with the name of the place, the exact quantity therein contained, with the improvements thereon, (if any), and the value of such improvements, on oath, to the Commissioner of the Land Office, for due examination, within six months from the date hereof; and for so doing this shall be your sufficient Warrant and Authority.

To the Surveyor of Anne Arundel County.

The Surveyor must state in his return, that no portion of the land embraced in said survey is covered by navigable water.
