



Proceeding was instituted to determine liability of parent for damage caused by child. The Circuit Court of Baltimore City, Division of Juvenile Causes, Robert I. H. Hammerman, J., entered an order for restitution by mother, and an appeal was taken. The Court of Special Appeals, Orth, C. J., held that at de novo hearing on matter of restitution to be paid by mother for damage caused by child, it was necessary that evidence sufficient in law be adduced to establish both that child had committed acts resulting in damage mother might be required to pay and that he had done so willfully or maliciously; and that deficiencies pertaining to conduct of de novo hearing on matter of restitution to be paid by mother for damage caused by child required conclusion that order for restitution deprived mother of her property without due process of law.

Order reversed, case remanded for new hearing with respect to liability of parent.

A juvenile was found delinquent by the Circuit Court, Baltimore City, Division of Juvenile Causes, Robert I. H. Hammerman, J., and the juvenile appealed. The Court of Special Appeals, Orth, C. J., held that even if the juvenile lied to an officer concerning the place from where he was running and even if such statement was admissible, it was not enough, though added to the fact that he was identified as one of three boys on one side of the street at the scene of a purse snatching, to establish his guilt beyond reasonable doubt of a purse snatching which was actually effected by one of two boys across the street. Had judicial notice of a purse-snatching pattern been proper, the evidence would still have been insufficient.

Judgment vacated; order for restitution vacated, and case remanded.

Mother, having been ordered to make full restitution for mischief done by son, who broke into a grocery store in company with another, appealed from the Circuit Court of Baltimore City, Division of Juvenile Causes, Robert I. H. Hammerman, J. The Court of Special Appeals, Lowe, J., held that mother's argument that statute authorizing a parent to be cited for contempt if he fails to make restitution violated constitutional prohibition on imprisonment for debt was premature where although debt had been incurred mother had not been held in contempt for violation nor had payment of the restitution order been otherwise enforced and that restitution may be assessed entirely against one parent and is not required to be apportioned on basis of the infant's mischief.

The Circuit Court for Baltimore City, Division of Juvenile Causes, Robert I. H. Hammerman, J., denied juvenile's motion to suppress evidence, and juvenile appealed. The Superior Court of Baltimore City, J. Harold Grady, J., after verdict for employee set aside award of punitive damages against employer, and employee appealed. Proceeding on petition for waiver of juvenile court's jurisdiction over juvenile alleged to be delinquent. From an order of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, Division of Juvenile Court, Robert I. H. Hammerman, J., the juvenile appealed. The Court of Special Appeals, Gilbert, J., held, inter alia, that where 16-year-old girl, who was unlicensed driver, drover her boyfriend's automobile and killed a two-year-old child when automobile ran onto sidewalk, where girl offered testimony that she was active in civic affairs, that she was very concerned about what had happened, and that reverend of church which the girl attended expressed the opinion that if the girl were tried in juvenile court it would be a greater help to her than being tried in criminal court, juvenile judge's waiving jurisdiction of juvenile court constituted an abuse of discretion.

Proceeding on petition for waiver of juvenile court jurisdiction over infant alleged to be delinquent for reason that he committed robbery with deadly weapon.
