4<sup>th</sup> day of June, Eighteen hundred and twenty one, I came Daniel  
Morrison and makes oath on the Holy Evangelys of  
Almighty God, that on or about the month of September,  
in the year Eighteen hundred and fourteen, a certain  
Negro Slave his Property, named John Dublin, aged  
about twenty four or five years, absconded with the British  
Army then at Sanjers Islands, within the said State of  
Maryland
