The will of Thomas Jenkins a copy of which is
 filed shows - that John M. Jenkins is the Executor
 & residuary legatee under the will of his father
 Thomas Jenkins dec'd. & entitled in his own right to this
 slave Bob - There is also filed a deed of gift from
 Mrs Jenkins in his life time to his son John M. Jenkins
 for Miss Prob. - so that as executor & in his own
 right, he is entitled to receive payment for Bob -

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Jenkins of Calvert County in the State of Maryland for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have and bear unto my dear children Jane Jenkins Thomas W Jenkins Rebecca Jenkins and John M Jenkins (and) also for other good causes and considerations me thereunto moving have given granted and confirmed and do by these presents give grant (and) confirm unto my said children the negroes slaves herein after mentioned in manner and form following, that is to say I give unto my Daughter Jane Jenkins three negroes slaves names as follows Mariak and her increase Jim and Dick, I give unto my Son Thomas W Jenkins one negro boy slave name Major, I give unto my Daughter Rebecca Jenkins three negroes slaves names as follows Sarah (and) her increase Isaac and Leonard, I give to my son John M Jenkins one negro slave names Bob, to have and to hold the aforesaid negroes unto my said children their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns forever...

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand (and) seal this twelfth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred (and) four...

Maryland To wit. Be it Remored to all people whom it may concern
Directing that I Thomas Jenkins of Calvert County of the State aforesaid, for
clear good reasons and considerations me thereunto moving do hereby declare free
manumit and enfranchise the following negroes to wiff. Minny age thirty two years
to be free directly, Job age twenty eight years to be free directly, Ben age seven
years to serve until he is twenty six years of age, Richard age twenty one years to serve
seven years, David age one year and two months to serve until he is twenty six years
of age, Tom four weeks to serve until he is twenty six years of age. In Testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this twenty
fifth day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred
and Seventeen.

He it remembered that
on this tenth day of November, in the year
eighteen hundred & twenty three, personally
appears Jonathan Morgan before the subscriber
a Justice of the Peace in & for the County afore-
said & makes oath on the Holy Evangelists of
Almighty God, that in the year eighteen hun-
-dred & fourteen, two negro men - named Bob & Flay -
(the former about sixteen years of age - & the latter
about fifty years of age) - both plantation
hands - & the said Bob worth about three
hundred & fifty dollars - & the said Flay worth
about one hundred dollars - in the last men-
-tioned year went away & absented themselves
from the service of Thos. Jenkins then of
the County & State aforesaid, but late of the
County of Monroe in the State of Indiana
& belonged to the said Thos. Jenkins - or some of his children,
& were taken off or carried away by the British
as this deponent newly believes - a number of
British Rebels being in the Chesapeake Bay
at the time contiguous to the then dwelling
place of the said Thos. Jenkins - the said
negros were returned again to the service of
the said Thos. Jenkins to the knowledge or
belief of this deponent - who was a near
neighbour of the said Thos. Jenkins, & well
acquainted with the said Bob & Flay -
& further saith not -
