Col^o John Broome about forty five years of age - & Mr James D. Denton about forty years of age, being first duly sworn, deposed & saith - That in the year eighteen hundred & fourteen, in the month of August - they at different times (That is to say they were not in company with each other) saw persons clasped the slave for life of Mr Alexander Broome - aged about nineteen years - in the possession of the Militia - which persons deponents suppose was worth three hundred dollars, at the time above specified - They further state, that they were told by some of the Militia officers, that Sarah the slave likewise of Mr Alex^r Broome, aged about thirty nine years of age, & worth two hundred dollars at the time above said was then on board of a Militia armed vessel & further say not - And at the same time Mr James M. Broome being first duly sworn, deposed & saith, that he saw persons Sarah the slave of Mr Alex^r Broome in the possession of the Militia in the year eight - seen hundred & fourteen in the month of August - the said Mrs Sarah being then about thirty nine years of age & worth two hundred dollars, & further saith not - given under our hands this twenty fourth day of April in the year eighteen hundred & twenty one - John Broome
