on board the British Ship San Domingo
Commanded by Admiral Warren. And
on enquiry of the Officer of the Deck (a
Lieutenant) of the following named Negroes
viz. Adam, Phil, and Sandy the Property
of the said Charles John Canoll late of Prince
Georges County deceased were onboard
