On this 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1821 came before me a Justice of the Peace for Calvert County Joseph W. Reynolds and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God that he was taken prisoner by British under the Command of Commodore Barry in June 1814 and whilst on board of one of the Barges he saw negro Mary the property of Miss Ann MacKall received on board of the same Barge and that she was carried down the River Patuxent to the British Squadron. He believes that the said woman Mary was worth at that time three hundred dollars being about 22 years of age.
