On this 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1821 Before me the Subscriber One of the Justices of the peace in and for said County, Appears Negro Abraham of good character, and makes oath on the holy Evangel of Almighty God that he was at work in the Cornfield with Negro man Michael the property of John G. Mackall, when he went from the Landing in the canoe belonging to the Plantation and he was taken on board of a Barge and carried down the River.

Mackall and makes oath on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God that in June 1814 when the British barges said to be commanded by Commo. Barry was returning down the Patuxent River from their expedition against Lower Marlborough that he was informed by his Negroes, that his Negro man Michael aged twenty nine years, and worth at that time five Hundred Dollars, went from his Landing in a canoe to the British barges and was received on board of one of them and carried down the River.

On this 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1821 Before me the Subscriber One of the Justices of the peace in and for said County Appears John Broome and makes oath on the holy Evangel of Almighty God that in June 1814 when the British barges said to be commanded by Commo. Barry was returning down the Patuxent River from their expedition against Lower Marlboro<sup>gh</sup>, that he was on his Island from which place he saw John G. Mackalls Negroes at work in said Mackalls Cornfield that he saw one of them go from the said Mackalls Landing in a canoe to the British barges and was received on board of one of them and carried down the River; that he understood and believes it was Negro Man Michael the property of the aforesaid John G. Mackall, Aged at that time about twenty nine years & worth Five Hundred Dollars that he the said Broome is a Neigh Neighbour of the said Mackalls and has never seen or heard of said Negro Michael since.
