

The claim of Mr Morgan Executor of J. Morgan is submitted in the affidavits filed in his case - The agent states that he has carefully examined the documents furnished by the British Government & printed by order of the Commissioners - that he finds on said list three negroes named, Chany, whose names are variously spelled, page 11 Cheena Hamilton - page 33 Shaney doomis & page 105 Shan-ny Lowing - all of whom appear to have been within the waters of the U States after the peace - that in the list of claims there appears to be but two negroes claimed whose names bear any resemblance to the claimants - one named China claimed by J C Cabott of Virginia & Chany the negro of Morgan the present claimant -

on page 11 of the British list is found two negroes having the same names with those claimed by Morgan - viz, Cheena & Kate - they both seem first to have entered the Regulus - both are omitted to be entered on her Books - both transferred from her on the 21 Feb. 1815 & on the 13 May 1815 both are discharged from the Caylon at Melville Island - these two negroes appear constantly together & are most likely the same negroes lost by Mr Morgan

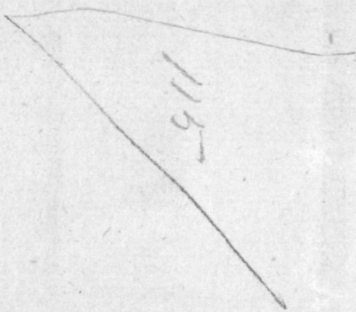
