 on this Tenth day of May Eighteen Hundred and Twenty one personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the County aforesaid Peregrin Bowen and made oath on the Holy evangel of Almighty God that on the thirty first day of August Eighteen Hundred and Fourteen while the British enemy lay in the Patuxent river that he the said Peregrin Bowen did see the above negroes Polly Grope 25 years of age and worth three hundred dollars, Mahaly 4 or 5 years of age and worth two hundred dollars, Clarity 2 years of age and worth one hundred dollars

before me a Justice of the Peace in and for the  
County aforesaid John Bushler and made oath  
on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God that some  
time in the month of August eighteen hundred and  
=one while the British enemy lay in the  
River Patuxent that he the deponent saw the  
Negroes of Mr Benjamin Bowen by the names  
of Polly, Groppe, Mahaly, and Clary, and sup-  
=pose them to be worth Six Hundred dollars, they  
were with the British on their way to the  
Shipping and very believes they went on board.

At the same time appeared William  
Wood and made oath on the the Holy Evangel  
of Almighty God that he saw the negroes  
of Mr Bowen Polly Mahaly & Clary and  
suppose them to be worth at that time Six  
Hundred dollars, with the British on their  
way on Board and he very believes that they  
did go on Board with them as they have never  
been in the neighbourhood since
