1821 personally appears Robt. Libburn & James  
Daffin before me the subscriber a Justice of  
the peace, and makes oath on the Holy  
Evangel of almighty God that the within  
valuation is as near the current prices of  
said slave, as they can ascertain, and what  
such slave would have sold for at the  
time the loss was sustained, to the best of  
their knowledge and belief.

We the undersigned Having been Called on by Benjamin  
Clocker. to set a valuation on one Negro Slave  
the property of the said Clocker, agreeable to In-  
structions from Mr Adams Secretary State.  
requesting all persons that lost Slaves to trans-  
mit without delay to the department of State  
Authenticated proof of the number of Slaves  
Carried away, and of their value by the current  
prices at which they might have been sold for  
at the time the loss was sustained, do value  
and appraise his one as follows

1 Negro Man named Henry, aged 19 years  
three hundred & fifty dollars — 350.00

I hereby Certify that Benifer Taylor Gentle-  
man, before whom the within affidavit appeared to have  
been taken and whose name is thereto signed, was at  
the time of taking thereof and still is one of the Justices

faith and credit are and ought to be given as well  
in Courts of Justice as otherwise.

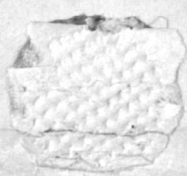

that Henry the Property of Benjamin Clocker Left him on  
the same Night that M<sup>r</sup>. Mackall & M<sup>r</sup>. Bromie's Negroes  
went off, and never returned to his Knowledge, the deponent  
further Saith that the above Negroe Lived in the same Neigh:  
:bourhood and within Half a mile of M<sup>r</sup>. Bromie

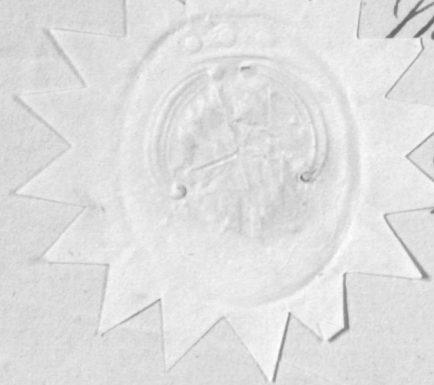
