Be it remembered that on this 18th day of January 1828 personally appeared, before the subscriber a justice of the peace in and for the District and County aforesaid, Thomas Bellamy of lawful age and made oath on the holy Evangel of almighty God, that he is not interested in the matter about which he is about to depose and that he is well acquainted with the fact that Telegraphus Bellamy of Prince Georges County, who is still living, was lawfully possessed of two slaves the one named Peter Ridout aged about twenty five years and the other named Andrew Ridout aged about twenty one years before the time when the British Army under the command of General Ross occupied the City of Washington in the District of Columbia in the year 1814 and continued so to possess them up to that time and that the said slaves Peter and Andrew Ridout at that time left their said masters services, were seen in and with the said Army upon their retreat towards Benedict on the Patuxent River and have not, since that time either returned to their said masters or been heard of or known in this country to the best of his knowledge and belief

1828.
