Personally appeared before the subscriber one of the Judges of the first judicial District of Maryland Thomas Harding and George Harding and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God that Harry Smith Hawkins Executor of Joseph Young and Guardian to Robert Young son of the late Joseph Young lost the following Negroes which said Negroes slaves were taken on board the British ship called the Dragon Commodore Barry then lying in the River Potomack in the year eighteen and thirteen and about the first of November of that year a Negro Man named Robert Courcy the husband of Jenny Courcy the property of William C. Somerville who was taken at the same time) a Negro woman named Maria, the wife of Ben Fuller also the property of William C. Somerville who was taken at the same time) also Stephen and Thomas children of Maria above named - sworn to before me this fourteenth day of January Eighteen hundred and Twenty eight.

The proof being taken over again before Judge Plater and from the facts of loss being stated in the original certificate of the Magistrate to have been sustained in 1812 when it was in 1813 - an error of the Magistrate taking the proof -

 son of the said Joseph Young lost the following
 negroes, which said negroes was taken on board
 the British ship called the Dragon Commodore Perry
 Master lying then in the River Potomac in the
 year of eighteen hundred & twelve
 one negro man Robert aged about sixty one years
 of age and Valued at eighty Dollars, one negro
 woman Maria twenty four years of age Valued at
 four Hundred Dollars, one negro Boy, Stephen
 aged four years Valued at one Hundred Dollars
 one negro boy Thomas two years old Valued
 at sixty Dollars. In Witness my hand I seal this
 the ninth day of September eighteen hundred
 and thirty
