On this 31st January 1828 personally appeared James Calvert before me a Justice of the Peace for the State and County aforesaid and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God that he the said James Calvert did see Andrew Calvert the property of William Scafer Esq. on board of the British Vessel lying at Bennedit time about the last of August 1814 and was then serving as a Waiter to one of the Officers, sworn to before me a Justice of the Peace the day and year above written
