




State of Maryland, Somerset County, to wit -

I Edward Coulbourn do make oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, that on or about the month of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and fourteen my negro man Bob slave for life, ran off and went on board some of the British Vessels lying in Tangier sounds and was by them carried away. That he was a stout and healthy Man aged about twenty one years and according to the prices current at that time would have sold for the sum of four hundred dollars. Witness my hand and seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty one -






