 for that year - that she has always understood  
 said Moses was carried away by the British  
 naval forces then in Patuxent River, since  
 which he has never returned and further

The claim of Artemisia Skinner, now of  
Prince George's County, Maryland, is respectfully  
submitted —

This claim is for one negro man  
named Moses Grose — the loss of whom is established  
see the evidence file.

The Commissioners are referred to page  
20. of the documents. for the name of Moses  
Grose — a colonial marine on board of the  
Regulus.

The slight variation in the spelling of the  
surname "Grose"; from that of "Grop" the name proved  
by the witness the Skinner. can it is presumed <sup>not</sup> <sup>affect</sup> <sup>weaken</sup>  
the right of the claimant to recovery — as the same  
surname spelt in both ways — sounds when pro-  
-nounced alike
