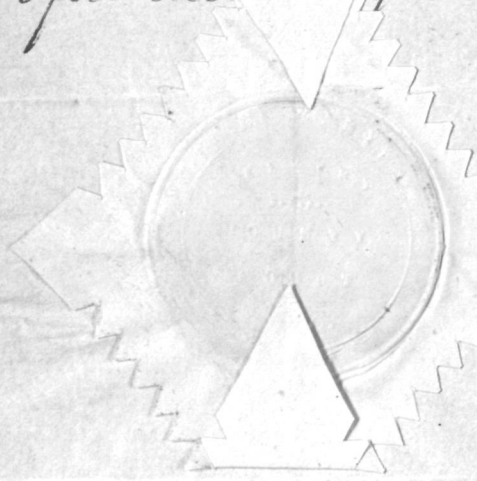


State of Maryland Calvert County To wit

the holy Evangelys of Almighty God that negro
Sam aged about thirty years (who was the property
of Tho: E. King deceased) and who was ^{supposed}
supposed to be taken away by the British during the
late war with Great Britain, was known
and called by the name of Saml. Cary that
said negro Saml. Cary was purchased of
the aforementioned Martha Wilson by the said
Tho: E. King in his life time for the sum of three
Hundred Dollars

Negro Sam. the Property of Thomas & King taken from Calvert County about the last of August 1814 on board of a ship belonging to the British, in the Squadron under the command of Admiral Cockburn his age and value as follows viz:

Negro man Sam age thirty six years, value at what Thomas & King purchased him for a very short time before
\$300-00

Calvert County J^{ts} Then came Thomas E. King before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace for the County aforesaid in the State of Maryland and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God to the truth of the above statement
sworn before

May 29. 1821

at the same time came Jacob B. Hester before the subscriber a Justice of the Peace for the County and State aforesaid and made Oath on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God that he was informed by Mrs Wilson who sold Negro Sam to Thomas & King for \$300-00 and the said Negro was taken by the British about the last of August 1814 to the best of his knowledge
