to believe that the said negroes the property

the British Fleet as the said negroes has never
returned on board of since

Negroes went off in the Summer of 1814 at

in the Patuxent a short distance from and
in full view of the House of said Wells
that the said Negroes have never been seen
by him since that time and he has no
doubt they went on board the Fleet, that
Jane Stewart went off in company with an
Negro Man called Tom Smith the Slave
of one of the Neighbory whose name she
may have taken - after getting on board
