Queen Anne's County Court: Maryland. Be it remembered that on
this seventeenth day of March in the year eighteen hundred and twenty
eight personally appeared before me the subscriber a justice of the
peace in and for Queen Anne's County, Samuel Chase of said
County, who being sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God,
deposes & saith that he knew a negro woman named Trip or
Triscilla Clayton, belonging to a certain Jacob Tolson deceased
that the said negro woman Trip or Triscilla Clayton was
taken and carried away by the British during the late
war between England and America, that the said negro woman
Trip or Triscilla Clayton was never regained by the said
Jacob Tolson in his lifetime or by his Executors or other
representatives since his death, and that the said negro
woman Trip or Triscilla Clayton was entirely lost to the
said Jacob Tolson and his Estate -
