Grace Tunky and Sobby Tunky, and two negro boys named Charles

belonging to Keyiah James, of said County, that the said negroes
were taken & carried away by the British during the late War
between England & America, that the said negroes were never
regained by the said Keyiah James, and that the said negroes
were entirely lost to her -
