On this 20th day March 1828. appeared Martha
Wilson before me the Subscriber a Justice of the
Peace in and for the County aforesaid, and
made oath on the Holy Evangelij of Almighty
God that in the year 1814 she heard a
Conversation between a Negro man named Jerry
Loney the property of Thomas Blake of the
County and State aforesaid, and one of her
Negro men named Colonel, he the said Jerry
Loney said that he intended going immediately
on board of the enemy then lying in the
Chesapeake Bay, and the deponent further

aveth, that she had every reason to believe
that the said Jerry Loney did go on board of
the enemy, with his wife and a number
of the deponent's other Negroes

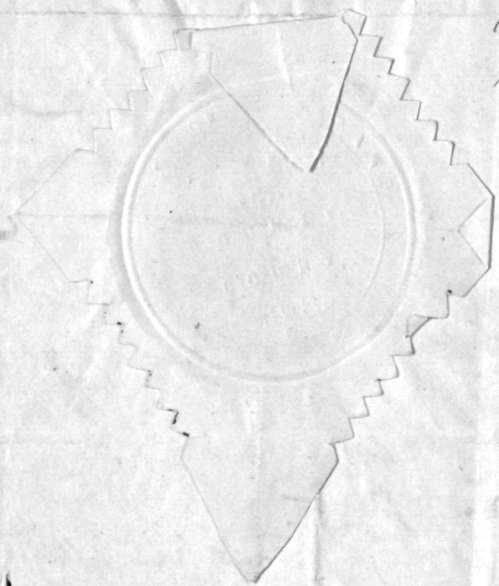

March 8th 1823 Personally appeared before me
the subscriber a Justice of the Peace for Calvert
County Mary Blake the widow and Dominus
=tratrix of Thos Blake late of Calvert County
deceased and being sworn on the Holy Evangelis of
Almighty God deposes & says that the aforesaid
Thos Blake in the year 1814 lost two negro men
who she believes went to the British one called
Red Green went off in June 1814 when the British
came up the river pursuant to the town of
Lower Marlbro. from a plantation belonging
to said Thomas Blake adjoining the town
of Lower Marlbro. the said negro Red was
aged about 30 years the other negro man
named Jerry went off in October of the
same year from the dwelling plantation of
said Thomas Blake lying on the Chesapeake
Bay a British Squadron was lying in sight
of the dwelling house at the time the said
Jerry went off, and he was at that time
aged about 30 years.

W Reynolds and made oath on the Holy Evangelis
of Almighty God that in June 1814 he was taken

prisoners by the British at the town of Laver
and by them carried down the Patuxent River
to their ships. That on board the same barge
in which he was carried down the river he
saw Ned Green a Negro man aged about
26 years the property of Thos Blake late of Calvert
County dec^d

a Justice of the peace for Calvert County Joseph
Blake and Joseph M Reynolds of the County
and State aforesaid and made oath on the
Holy Evangelists of almighty God that they knew
Ned Green and Jerry described in the above
deposition and that they was worth at the time
they went off Jerry five hundred dollars and
Ned Green three hundred and fifty dollars
