The State of Maryland Queen Anns County to wit
On the 20th day of November in the year Eighteen hundred
and twenty One personally appeared before me the subscriber
One of the Justices of the Peace in and for said County
Henry Pullen a Citizen of Queen Anns County. who made
Oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God. that on
Or about the 2nd day of August in the year Eighteen
hundred and thirteen, the British Troops under the Command
of General Hewitt. accompanied by the Naval Command
of Admiral Warren, took possession of Kent Island
and continued to occupy the same till about the
twenty second day of the same month - that during the
same time the British took from him one Negro slave
named Phill of the age of fourteen years and of the
value of five hundred Dollars eight head of grown
Cattle of the value of eighteen Dollars each one
yoke of Hauling Steers of the value of fifty Dollars
One large blooded mare with foal of the value of
one hundred Dollars - forty six head of sheep valued
at two Dollars and fifty Cents each - one pair of
Horse pistols and Bolsters of the value of twenty Dollars
One good fawling Piece of the value of five Dollars
fifty Head of Geese valued at fifty Cents each -
forty Head grown fowls valued at twenty Cents each
two saddles and one plated Bridle of the value of
twenty Dollars - a quantity of Oats and a variety of house
hold goods estimated at fifteen Dollars

May 1821, Henry Mullen personally appeared

of the peace for the State of Maryland in and
for Queen Anns County aforesaid and made
oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God
that the above statement of his Slave being
taken & carried away by the British is true
to the best of his knowledge. —
