The State of Maryland Queen Anns County to wit on
the 20th day of Jan in the year 1821 personally appeared
before me one of the Justices of the peace for the County aforesaid
William Carckson a Citizen of said County who made Oath
on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God that on or about the 2^d day of
August in the year 1813 the British troops under the Command of
General Beckwith, accompanied by the Naval Command of
Admiral Warren, took possession of Kent Island and continued
to occupy the same till about the 22nd day of August that during the
same time the British took from him one Negro Slave Named
Tom of the age of 21 years of the Value of Five Hundred Dollars
Seven head of Cattle of the Value of Eighty four Dollars -
at the same time personally appeared John Cockey and
made Oath also in like manner that he knew Negro
Tom mentioned in the deposition of William Carckson that
he believes him to have been at the time mentioned in the said
deposition of the age of twenty one and that he verily believes
him to have been at the time he was taken of the Value of
five Hundred Dollars, and the said William Carckson the owner
aforesaid, and the said John Cockey the witness aforesaid believe
that the said Negro Tom was in the possession of the British
forces at the time of the exchange of the ratification of the
Treaty of Ghent, and carried away by the British forces after
the peace
