

A negro man named Monday aged 30 the slave of Jacob Foulard was taken on Board of a British ship of war on or about the 24 October 1814 then lying in the Chesapeake bay opposite sharp Point in the state of Maryland.

 Then personally appeared Jacob Foulard before me the subscriber a Justice of the peace of the state of Maryland in and for Calvert county and made oath on the holy evangelist of almighty God that the above negro man named Monday aged 30 years was his property at the time he was taken on board of a British ~~ship~~^{ship} of war as above stated

years and made oath on the holy evangelies of almighty
god, that on Sunday evening being the 23rd of October
1814, he saw a negro man belonging to Mr Jacob Freeland
named Monday who had Mrs Martha Wilson, being
for a wife, which he believes the said man went off
to the Britists then lying off sharp Island with the
Slaves of said Martha Wilson on Monday morning being
the 24th of October 1814

he believes that the said man went off to the British
then lying of sharp Island with the slaves of said Martha
Wilson on Monday morning being the 24th of October
1814
