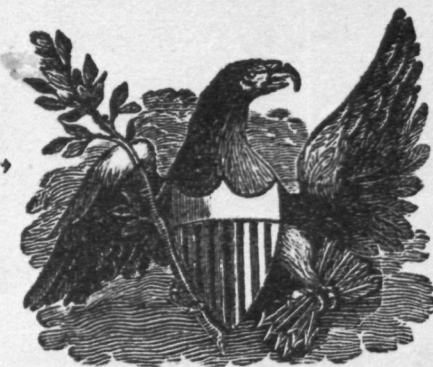
P.S. May 7. I open to enclose Mr Green's

I, JOHN GILL, Notary Public, by Letters  
Patent under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland,  
Commissioned and duly Qualified, residing in the City of  
Baltimore, in the State aforesaid, do hereby Certify,

Attest and Make Known, That on the day of the  
date hereof before me personally appeared Josias Green of  
Patapsco neck near North point, Baltimore County State of  
Maryland, and made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty  
God That while the British fleet lay in the Chesapeake Bay  
off North point a large British army were landed from on  
board that fleet at and near North point under the  
command of Lieutenant General Ross with a view to attack  
Baltimore and on their advance towards Baltimore on Monday  
the 13<sup>th</sup> September 1814 they took a blackman named Sam  
a slave to deponent having in his charge two horses which  
they also took and as deponent believes sent him on board  
said fleet, since when deponent has not seen or heard of  
him, the last account deponent had of him that he was  
seen by one of deponent's neighbours at his house in the  
possession of the British, that said slave at that time was  
about thirty two years of age, about five feet ten inches  
stout and chunky and a little bow legged and was  
worth five hundred dollars

At the same time appeared as aforesaid Benjamin Watts  
of Patapsco neck aforesaid and made oath on the Holy Evangelists  
of Almighty God That he resides about a mile from the  
dwelling of Josias Green above named and is well acquainted

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with him and with his family and knows Mr Green had a  
negro man slave named Sam, who deponent saw in the  
possession of the British on Monday the 12 September 1814 at  
deponents house when they were on the advance for Baltimore  
and deponent verily believes the British took said slave with  
them on board said fleet, that the description and value  
of said slave which Mr Green has given in his deposition is  
as deponent believes strictly just and true and deponent  
has not seen said slave since that time. Deming & Mott
