following negroes went to the British then being in
the patent River (from the farm of the said Nicholas
Sewall, viz. Jim, Beck, Grace, Jack, Bridget,
Grace, Milly, Jack (carpenter) Isaac (carpenter)
Pegg, Charles — Moses (carpenter) Enoch,
John, George — (the last four mentioned negroes
went to the British some time before the others
went), this deponent further deponent & saith
that there was several children taken away by
these parents at the same time, the names &
number not recollecte^d —
