Maryland Prince Georges County To Wit

It is remembered that on this 12th day of May 1828 appeared before me the subscriber a Justice of the Peace in and for the County aforesaid John H. Hall and Maketh Oath that he was well acquainted with a Mulatto man named Robert Wanton the property of George Biscoe (now deceased) and that said slave lived at the house of John S. Brooke, Esq. in the Town of Upper Marlboro' at the period of the British being quartered in said Town and that on the retreat of the British to their Shipping he well knew that said Robert Wanton accompanied them, and he knows said slave has never returned to his owner.

 and State aforesaid would have sold for the above
 mentioned sum of six hundred dollars at the time he
 was taken or conveyed away.

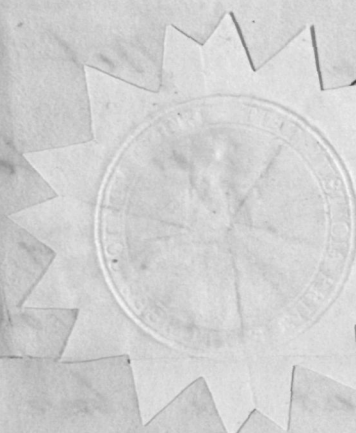
