

The State of Maryland Queen Anne County to West, on
the 13th day of Sept. 1821 personally appeared Walter H. White
a Citizen of said County before me one of the Justices of the
peace in and for said County, who made Oath on the
Holy Evangelist of almighty God that on or about the 2nd
day of August in the year 1813 the British Troops under
the Command of General Bickwith, accompanied by the
Naval Command of Admiral Warren, took possession
of Kent Island and continued to occupy the same till
about the 22nd day of the same month that during that
time the British took from the Representatives of Messrs
Goodhand, one of which said Walter H. White has
intermarried with to wit, one Negro Man called
Sam about twenty one years old of the Value of Five
Hundred Dollars - one Negro Man called Thomas about
19 years old of the Value of Five Hundred Dollars - one
Negro Woman called Minta aged 18 years of the Value
of Two Hundred fifty Dollars - one Negro Woman
called Hester aged 17 years of the Value of two hundred and
fifty Dollars —

at the same time personally appeared John Goodhand
and made Oath also in like manner. that he well
knew, Sam. Thomas. Minta and Hester mentioned in
the above deposition, that he believes them to have been
of the ages mentioned and that he verily believes them
to have been at the time they were taken of the Value
above stated - and the said Walter H. White the owner
aforesaid and John Goodhand the testifies off? believes
that the Negroes were in the possession of the British forces
at the time of the exchange of the Ratification of the
Treaty of Ghent, and carried away by the British forces
after the peace

of February 1820 Personally came Marmaduke
Goodhand a respectable white resident of the County
and State aforesaid who made oath in the Holy
Evangelists of Almighty God that he has perfect
knowledge and recollection that while the British
had possession of Kent Island in the County aforesaid
that they took and carried away a Negro man
Slave to Mr Harris of England that the said man
went by the name and was always known by
the name of Jacob Anderson - and he further
deposeth and saith that at the same time to wit
in the year eighteen hundred and thirteen there
was taken and carried away by the British
forces aforesaid under the command of Admi-
ral Warren four Negro Slaves from his Uncle
Marmaduke Goodhand ~~named~~ one named

Samuel Gallaway, one named Thomas Ander-
son, Araminta or Minky Berry, and Kesse Gallo-
way and he makes oath that he has perfect
knowledge and recollection of the going away of
the whole of the aforesaid Negroes and that the
he saith not that the above disposition was taken
and sworn to before me the day and year aforesaid
