of February 1828 then came James L. Bryan. a white
-etible Citizen of said County. who. was. overseer of the
-carvill of Kent Island in said County before me the said
-ber. a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland.
and for. Queen Anns County aforesaid and makes Oath
on the Holy. Evangelys of Almighty God. that. on the 2^d
of August. 1813. when the British left. Kent Island. in
said. County. they took away with them one negro. Man
named. Jacob. Matthews. slave of Elizabeth Carvill of said
County. the age of said negro. Jacob. Matthews was between
seventeen and. Eighteen years old. his. Complexion was of a
dark. Mulattos his height was. five feet. seven inches or
thereabout. and that. the said. Elizabeth Carvill nor. any
one for. her have had. possession of the said negro. Man
Jacob. Matthews. since that. time. nor. has she received
any Compensation directly or indirectly for the aforesaid
negro. Man Jacob. Matthews from any person or persons
whomsoever to the best. of his Knowledge
