Susan Payne, also deposite and sayeth, about a week after the above named negroes disappeared, the British Landed and brought in company with them to Saint Ingoys in the County aforesaid, two of the said negroes, which were Harry Hamet and Harry Fox; and that the said Harry^{Hamet} searched the house of the said deponent, he being authorised to do so by Admiral Cockburn. — The deponents further sayeth not. — Sworn before

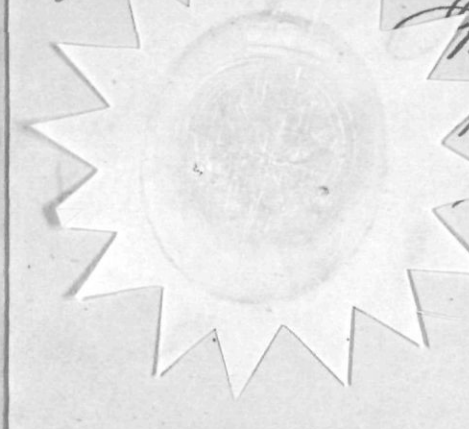

to his legal representatives because the award makes
no addition of Junor to the Name of John Mackale
The Honb Board will perceive from the depositions
filed and marked A & B, that the money in last
did belong to John Mackale Junior; and the last that
in some of the depositions the addition Junior is aff-
and can only be accounted for by inadvertency.
He therefore prays the Honb. Board to remedy the def-
iciency with the Treasury by amending the award so
as to supply the addition of Junor to John Mackale.
The words were made in the case of Jones vs. Brown
841 on the docket.

He will also be glad to state that in the
case of John Fitzpatrick he is informed that he the

three years so that no relief or power of attorney can

there is no doubt of their going to the British
but as to their being in the waters of the U.S.
at the time of peace I know not
I also send you certificates of two horses Claim
and as the property of my Mother Rebecca
Loken you will oblige me by prosecu-
ting as far as you can & Informing me from
time to time as to the progress
of such Claims &c

I also inform^{ing} respecting the Negroes
Claimed as Dr Thomson's, the Cyprian Court
say that Peter Gough as adm^r of Dr Thom-
son, have no right to Claim, on account
that ~~they were~~ the use of them were left
~~for~~ ^{to the first husband} Doct Dent to his
widow L. Dent, untill his daughter
arrived to the age of 21 years, the widow
serving Dr Thomson & he dying
before the daughter arrives at the age
of 21 years, the use becomes the Widows
again & the adm^r of Dr Thomson
has nothing to do with it. You have
the papers relative to them, & I concea-
-ve it my duty to prevent accumu-
-lation of expence I have married the dau-
-ghter & will soon be entitled to two thirds
of them according to the will of Doct.
Dent, & I am also authorised by my
mother in law to make this statement
I have no wish that the business should
be taken ^{out} of your hands but that Dr Gough
has no right to authorise or receive &c

as soon as possible with much respect

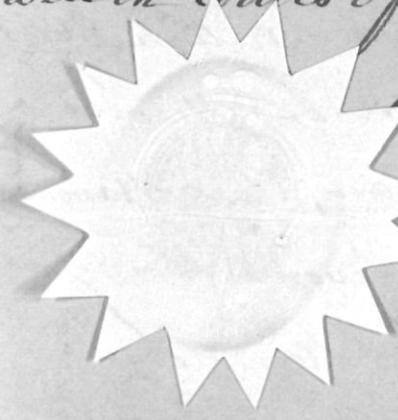

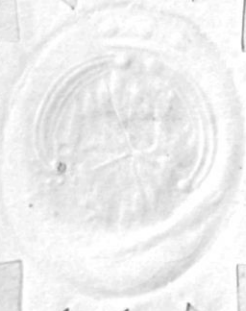
