

The State of Maryland Queen Anns County to West
on the 30th day of June in the year eighteen hundred & twenty one
personally appeared before me the subscriber one of the Justices
of the peace for Queen Anns County, John Goodhand a Citizen
of Kent Island in said County, who made Oath on the Holy
Evangelist of almighty God, that on or about the 2nd day of Au-
-gust in the year Eighteen Hundred & thirteen, the British Troops under
the Command of General Beakwith, accompanied by the Naval
Command of Admiral Warren, took possession of Kent Island
and continued to occupy the same till about the 22nd day of the
same month, that during the same time the British took
from him one Negro Slave called Dere, of the age of
twenty four years, of the Value of five hundred Dollars
one Negro Slave named Emory, of the age of twenty two
years of the Value of five hundred Dollars, four head of
Horses of the Value of two hundred Dollars, nine head of
Sheep of the Value of eighteen Dollars, six head of Cattle
of the Value of ninety Dollars, one Boat of the Value
of forty five Dollars, forty head of Geese of the Value of
twenty Dollars — at the same time personally appeared
James Richardson ^{son} and made Oath also in like manner
that he knew Negroes Dere, & Emory, mentioned in the deposition
of John Goodhand that he believed them to have been at the
time mentioned in the deposition of the ages before mentioned
and that he verily believes them to have been at the time they
were taken, each of the Value of five hundred Dollars — and the
said John Goodhand the owner afo^r, and the said James Richardson
the witness afo^r believes that the said Negroes were in
the possession of the British Forces at the time of the ^{exchange} of the Ratification
of the treaty of Ghent, and carried away by the British forces
after the peace

away by the British Troops under the command of
Admiral Horsman in August 1813.
