Maryland Prince Georges County J.C.

On this 14th day of June in the year of our Lord 1828 personally appears Edward H. Calvert of Prince Georges County aged about fifty one years, before the subscribed a Justice of the peace of the said State in and for the County aforesaid and being first duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God deposes and says that he hired a negro man named Daniel the property of Juliana Carrolle for the year Eighteen hundred and fourteen; that sometime in the month of August in the same year the said negro man Daniel left the employment of the Deponent, in company with several of his negroes and the Deponent has understood and believes that the said negro man joined the British forces then in the Patuxent River and was taken away by them. That the aforesaid negro never returned to the employment of the Deponent, or to Juliana Carrolle his mistress and further the Deponent saith not.
