Robert Marshall of Accomac County and
State of Virginia being duly sworn doth
depose and say that in November in
the year one thousand eight hundred
and fourteen he was taken prisoner
on board the Regulus 74 Ship Captain
Thomson that he saw while on board
said Ship the slave called David belonging
to John Miles and Joe or Joseph slave of
Priscilla Maddox of Governor County
and State of Maryland - that he heard
orders expressly given to take the said
Slaves on shore upon George's Island
and place them in the works upon
military duty - that he was well
acquainted with these Slaves having
known them while in the possession
of their owners - In testimony whereof
he has hereunto subscribed his

name this 10th day May 1828 -
