Pile Thomas Menta Heath and Juel Heath  
son of Menta Heath Slaves of Richard Bryan  
Heirs was known and generally by the above  
names and that they were carried away by the  
British in the late War and that ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> Thomas  
was about twenty one years of age Menta Heath  
was about thirty four years of age and that Juel  
Heath was about ten years of age
