The State of Maryland Queen Anne's County to Wit, on the
twenty-third day of June 1821 personally appeared, Maria Osborne
Justice of said County, before me one of the Justices of the
peace in and for said County, who made Oath on the Holy
Evangelist of Almighty God that on or about the 2nd day of August
in the year 1813 the British Troops under the Command of General
Brock with a accompanied by the Naval Command of Admiral
Warman, took possession of Kent Island and continued to occu-
py the same till about the 22nd day of the same month
that during the same time the British took from her -
one Negro Woman named Mintie of the age of thirty four
years of the Value of two hundred and fifty Dollars - one Negro
Man slave named Fild, of the age of 21 years, of the Value of
Five hundred Dollars, one Negro Boy slave named Sewel of the
age of 10 years of the Value of three hundred Dollars -
7 head of Cattle of the Value of twenty Dollars, thirty three
head of Sheep of the Value of sixty six Dollars - 27 head of
Hogs of the Value of fifty Dollars, 2 head of good work Horses
of the Value of one hundred Dollars, 50 head of Geese of the Value
of twenty five Dollars, six turkeys of the Value of five Dollars,
15 Ducks of the Value of four Dollars, 2 lbs. of sheet Iron Covered
of the Value of Ten Dollars -

at the same time personally appeared Henry Meardon
and made Oath also in like manner that he knew Negroes
Mintie, Fild and Sewel mentioned in the deposition of Maria
Osborne, that he believes the said Negroes to have been
at the time mentioned in the said deposition of the ages mentioned
and that he truly believes them to have been at the time they were
taken of the Value above stated and the said Maria Osborne
the Owner of^d and Henry Meardon the witness of^d believes that
the Negroes were in the possession of the British Forces at the
time of the exchange of the Ratification of the treaty of Ghent
and carried away by the British forces after the peace:
