The State of Maryland Queen Anns County to Wit,  
On the 11<sup>th</sup> day of Aug<sup>r</sup>. in the year eighteen hundred  
and twenty and personally appeared before me one  
of the Justices of the Peace for Queen Anns County  
Samuel W. Ringgold a citizen of Queen Anns County  
administrator of Jacob Ringgold (Deceased) who  
made oath on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God  
that on or about the fifth day of August in the  
year eighteen hundred & thirteen, the British troops  
under the command of Sir Sidney Beckwith accompanied  
by the naval command of Admiral Warren took  
possession of Kent Island and continued to occupy  
the same untill about the twenty second of the same  
month, that during that time they took from Jacob  
Ringgold, one Negro man Jesse of the age of  
nineteen <sup>years</sup> of the value of five Hundred Dollars one  
Horse of the value of fifty Dollars, one Bull of the  
value of twenty Dollars, one steer of the value of  
Twenty Dollars, one cow of the value of sixteen  
Dollars, one young steer of the value of twelve Dollars  
one young Heifer of the value of twelve Dollars  
thirty six sheep value of ninety Dollars eighty  
five Geese of the value of forty two Dollars & fifty  
cents — At the same time personally appeared  
Benjamin Ringgold and made oath in like manner  
that he knew negro Jesse mentioned in the depositions  
of Samuel W. Ringgold, that he believes  
him to have been at the time mentioned in the  
deposition of the age of nineteen years and that he  
verily believes him to have been at the time he  
was taken of the value of Five Hundred Dollars

The State of Maryland Queen Anns County to wit on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of April eighteen hundred & twenty four personally appeared before me one of the Justices of the Peace for Queen Anns County Samuel W. Kinggold a Citizen of Queen Anns County administrator of Jacob Kinggold (deceased) who made oath on the holy evan-gelists of almighty god that on or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of August eighteen hundred & thirteen the British troops under the command of Sir Sidney Beekwith accompanied by the naval command of Admiral Warren took possession of Kent State and continued to occupy the same untill about the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of the same month and year that during the same time they took from Jacob Kinggold one Negro Slave Jesse aged about 19 years - At the same time personally appeared James Benton and made oath in like manner that he knew the said Jesse mentioned in the deposition of Samuel W. King-gold ~~that he was taken by the British troops at the time he was taken~~ sworn to before me
