This State of Maryland Queen Anne's County to wit, on the eighteenth day of August
in the year eighteen hundred and twenty one personally appeared before me one of the Justices
of the peace for Queen Anne's County Heziah Garner, (the widow of the Late Philemon
Garner,) who made oath on the holy evangelist of almighty god that on or about the 5th
day of August 1813. the British troops under the command of Sir Sidney Beckwith accomp-
-anied by the naval command of Admiral Warren took possession of Hawk Island
and continued to occupy the same until about the twenty second day of the same month
that during the same time the British took from Philemon Garner one negro slave
named Grace aged about 45 years of the value of Two hundred Dollars, one negro
slave named Deborah aged about 19 years of the value of Three hundred and
fifty Dollars, one negro slave named Charles aged about eight years of
the value of Two hundred & fifty Dollars, one negro slave named Daniel
aged about five years of the value of Two hundred Dollars, one negro slave
named Alla aged about 18 months of the value of ^{Dollars} fifty Ten sheep of the
value of Twenty five Dollars one steer of the value of five Dollars one
hog of the value of five Dollars Twenty Bushels wheat of the value of
Thirty Dollars Twenty Geese of the value of Ten Dollars one Dozen ducks of
the value of Two Dollars one canoe of the value of five Dollars -

At the same time personally appeared Lemuel Legg and made oath in like manner
that he knew the above named negro slaves mentioned in the deposition of
Heziah Garner and that he believes them to have been at the time mentioned
in the said deposition, of the ages and value above mentioned, And Heziah Garner
the owner and Lemuel Legg the witness verily believes that the above mentioned
slaves was in the possession of the British at the time of the ratification of
the Treaty of Ghent. sworn to before me -
