Fort Armistead bill expected to pass

ANNAPOLIS - The House of Delegates is expected to pass a bill sometime Friday that would designate Fort Armistead Park in South Baltimore as the site for a planned 890 bed state prison instead of the current East Baltimore site at the old Continental Can Co. factory.

Details of the debate and vote were unavailable at presstime.
The bill, backed by

Acting Gov. Blair Lee III, calls for construction of a \$26 million prison at Fort Armistead, but has a clause requiring prison construction in East Baltimore if the Fort Armistead property, now held by the city, is not transferred to the state by Feb. 15, 1979.

It received preliminary approval Wednesday with little debate, but Del. Paul Weisengoff, D-Baltimore, who doesn't want the prison built in his district, said he will fight the bill to the end.

He recognizes the bill will pass.

The Fort Armistead measure has received the backing of the state black caucus and the Concerned Citizens of Baltimore.

The plan was offered as an alternative to Continental. Can after community pressure forced Lee to drop the East Baltimore site.

Experimental help for ex-offenders

Lodged in one of Baltimore's downtown hotels is a group of ex-offenders who stay there on a regular basis. Sur-prised? Want to know prised? what are they doing there?

Well, the 25 men are part of a 90 - day experimental program set up by the Prisoners Aid Association Inc., called the Residential Employment Program

In essence, it provides a place for the men to live while they spend all day looking for employment. The program is based on the assumption that the

main problem is that men need a job. They can get a jeb, but the difficulty cs in because their ce is unstable,' dames M. Korn, the center director:

Individuals who are accepted into the program must follow a strict list of 25 guidelines that can result in termination if they are violated. For example, the program forbids the use of drugs, and no visitors are permitted. 'A guy won't last 90 days here unless he isn't looking for a jcb," Korn boasted. "Anyone who has an attitude of 'I'm going to find a job,' they usually do."

Willie Durham is one or the exceptions. He has been a REP participant for more than 90 days and has had a job for one month. Durham, who says will be leaving next week, was granted a 30 -

"I don't think it's too many people who been here who can say they completed the program," Burham said. "As far as clations are conerned, it is too easy to get in trouble. But a man can eme here and make it." Edward Jenkins,

Durham's roommate, has been in the program for about one month and has not been hired yet.

'I got a lot of burgiaries on my record," Jenkins "Most jobs don't want that, but I got a chance of getting this job tomorrow through.






