WARD BEFORE GRAND JURY

Repeats His Statements About Pool Selling On Races.

Former Police Captain Bernard J. Ward went before the grand jury yesterday and repeated to that body his statement published in THE SUN last Tuesday that handbooks on races are being operated in Baltimore and that a poolroom is in operation on Richmond street. It is understood that Mr. Ward told the grand jury nothing different from what was published in THE SUN.

In the opinion of the grand jury, it is said, Mr. Ward furnished no tangible evidence for that body to act upon. When asked to furnish more definite information, it is said, the former police captain replied that he is not engaged in that business now. It is understood that the grand jury will not drop the matter.

"It is not my business to go out and get evidence for the grand jury," Mr. Ward said after leaving the Courthouse. "Marshal Farnan has about 1,000 policemen, and they can act on the information I gave the grand jury if that body sees fit to instruct them to do so."
