BALDWIN NEW MAN ON SCHOOL BOARD. MAYOR LIKELY TO NAME THE HOPKINS PROFESSOR TO VACANCY. MANY INDORSE HIM FOR THE POSITION. EDUCATORS ESPECIALLY FAVOR HIM AS A SUCCESSOR TO JUDGE CUNNINGHAM, WHO RESIGNED.

Unless something unexpected turns up Prof. Baldwin of the Johns Hopkins University will be appointed to the School Board to succeed Col. A. B. Cunningham, who recently accepted a position as judge of the Appeal Tax Court.

The first intimation earlier in the week that Prof. Baldwin would be named for the position by Mayor Mahool has brought forth numerous indorsements of such a selection from persons anxious to keep the School Board out of politics and to secure on the Board men well fitted to administer the school system.

Mayor Mahool has been in frequent conference with various educators in the City concerning the appointment, and it is practically certain that he will take the advice of these counselors. The Mayor feels a peculiar pride in the appointments he has thus far made to the School Board, and is anxious, apparently, to keep up his record by this appointment.

Prof. Baldwin, it is said, is still out of town, and his absence may prevent the Mayor's sending the appointment to the Council next Monday, as the Mayor has as yet had no opportunity to offer the position to him.
