

GOLDSBOROUGH FUNERAL HELD

Ex-Governor Laid To Rest In Cambridge Churchyard

Following funeral services in Baltimore yesterday for Phillips Lee Goldsborough, the body of the former Governor of Maryland and United States Senator was taken to Cambridge, Md., for burial.

In the old churchyard of Christ Protestant Episcopal Church in the city of the Eastern Shore where he has spent his earlier years, the 81-year-old Maryland Republican party leader was laid to rest among many generations of his family.

The Rev. Dr. Harry Lee Doll, rector of St. Paul's Church, officiated at the services, first at the home of the son, Phillips Lee Goldsborough, Jr., 4200 Wickford road, and then at Christ Church in Cambridge.

At the home, Dr. Doll was assisted by the Rev. S. Hilton Orrick, assistant at St. Paul's Church, and at Christ Church, Cambridge, by the Rev. Edward Thomsen, rector there.

Active pallbearers at the funeral services included five nephews: Heath D. Goldsborough, Phillips L. Goldsborough of Md., B. Powell Harrison, Jr., Lemuel Showell and Robin S. Lanier, and Judge W. Laird Henry and Capt. C. G. Hicks (USMC retired).
