Harford County I Herby Certify that I have Surveyed and Carefully Laid out for and in the name of William Reese of said County a part or parcel of Land in the Reserve Including part of what or parcel of Leased Land Called Chance originally on the 9th day of January 1759 Leased to the said William Reese for 42 acres Beginning at abounded White Oak standing on the south side of barren hill, and on the south side of Broad Creek and Running thence North Sixty two deg. East thirty five perches, North Forty three degrees East Sixty seven perches to a post, thence South Fifty four deg. East Fifty perches, North Eighty six degrees East nine perches and a half to abounded White Oak the Beginning of Chance, the tract of Leased Land Included in this Survey, thence North forty three degrees East Twenty one perches North thirty eight deg. West Twenty five perches and a half to abounded White Oak thence North Fifty eight degrees West forty six perches, South Fifty Two deg. West eighteen perches, North Forty eight deg. West Sixty four perches, North three degrees West fourteen perches to abounded Black Oak, thence North seventy deg. West fourteen perches, South forty three degrees West Seventy seven perches to abounded White Oak, thence South fourteen degrees East thirty two perches, South sixty eight deg. East eighteen perches and a half to two bounded White Oaks, thence North sixteen deg. East eighteen perches, North sixty five degrees East thirty two perches and thence by a straight line to the Beginning Containing and Laid out for sixty five acres more or less to be held by the name of Reese's Enlargement March the 31st 1787

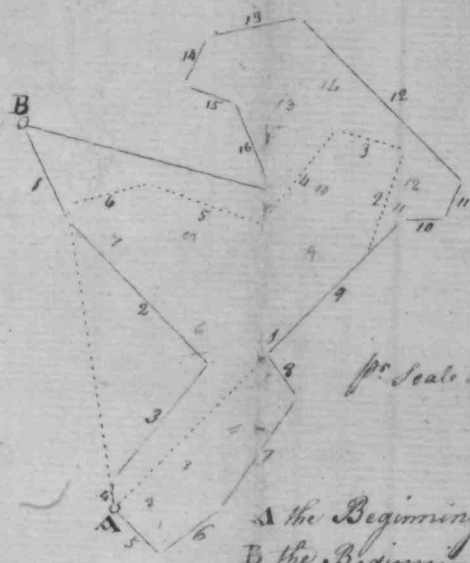
