By virtue of a special warrant issued out of the Land Office on the western shore of this State on the 26th day of January 1803 to lay out and resurvey for Bennett Jarrett of Harford County the following parcels of land lying and being in the County aforesaid and contiguous to each other Viz^t Deer park corrected originally on the 21st day of Jan^y 1799 granted Bennett Jarrett for $44\frac{3}{4}$ acres; and Perwicasity originally on the tenth day of May 1798 granted Bennett Jarrett for $16\frac{1}{2}$ acres. Nevertheless correcting and amending any errors in the original surveys and by my out lines to add any vacant land thereto contiguous be the same cultivated or otherwise &c.

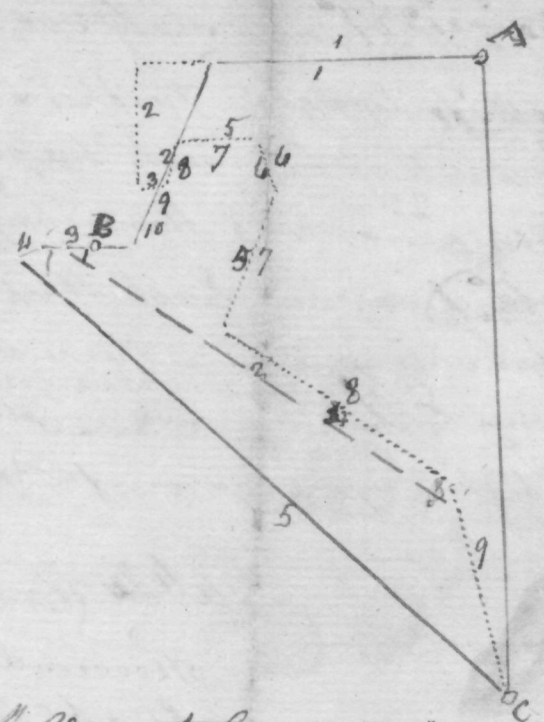
I Hereby certify that I have Resurveyed and carefully laid out for and in the name of the said Bennett Jarrett the aforesaid tracts of land according to their ancient notes and bounds as shewed to me Beginning for Perwicasity at the letter A on the plat containing one hundred and seventy seven acres; Beginning for Deer park corrected at the letter B on the plat containing forty six acres and shall. I have also excluded the quantity of ten acres part of Perwicasity part of an elder survey called Salisbury plain and have added the quantity of seventy three acres and a half of vacant land at the letter C on the plat and lastly I have reduced the residue of said tracts with the vacancy added into one entire tract bounded as follows Viz^t Lying in Harford County Beginning at one of the mile Stones Standing in the Pennsylvania line near the Tent meeting house it being the beginning of the original tract called Perwicasity and also the beginning a tract of land called Salisbury Plane and running thence bounding on Salisbury plane the four following courses Viz^t South one hundred and forty perches South sixty six degrees East one hundred and six perches South forty eight perches South twenty two degrees East fourteen perches untill it intersects the first line of a tract of land called Contestible manner N^o 1 thence bounding on said line reversely North forty three degrees East three hundred and forty five perches to the Pennsylvania line thence bounding on said line to the place of beginning containing two hundred and eighty seven acres more or less to be held by the name of Beautiful Plains January the 16th 1804

of Maryland The petition of Bennett Jarrett of Stafford County
Sheweth, That your petitioner on the 25th day of January 1803, obtained
out of the Western Shore Land Office, a special warrant to resurvey the following
lands in said County, and contiguous to each other vizt. Deer park Corrected
and Perseverance, originally on the 10th day of May 1798. granted ~~Bennett~~
your petitioner for 107 acres, In pursuance whereof a resurvey was
made, and a Certificate returned by the name of Beautiful Plains
and containing 287 acres, 46³/₄ acres whereof is vacancy added, for which
your petitioner paid to the Treasurer of the Western Shore the sum
of \$11. 18. 1¹/₂ Cents, and ~~\$4. 12. 6.~~ \$6. 7. 0 for Improvements
thereon according to Law, But upon application for a patent, he is
informed that the first named original is erroneously expressed in
the warrant and Certificate, and should have been Deer park
Corrected & Again, which was on the 21st of January 1799 granted
your petitioner for 146³/₄ acres, and which is the Land actually resurveyed,
and which is a resurvey made in virtue of a proclamation warrant for
Deer park Corrected, Your petitioner therefore prays that a
patent may issue to him on his said Certificate of resurvey and
as an duty bound he will pray &c. B. Jarrett.
