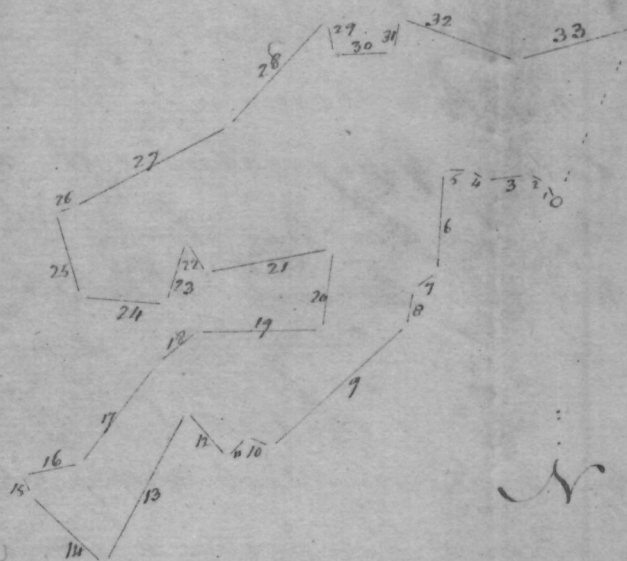

Laid out for John Barclay and John Love Esq^{rs} a tract or parcel
of the Reserve Land in Hayford County Beginning at a place in
the Given Line of a tract of Land called the Grove North twenty
four degrees West ten perches distant from a bounded Chestnut
Chestnut standing on the North side of said Barclay's Spring
Branch and Running thence South twenty four degrees East
ten perches to the said Boundary thence South sixty three degrees
East eleven perches North five degrees East twenty four perches
South fifty two degrees East nine perches South eighty eight deg^s
East fourteen perches to a bounded Spanish Oak thence North five
degrees East fifty five perches North fifty six degrees East fifteen perches
North twelve degrees East twenty perches to a bounded Spanish
Oak thence North forty nine degrees East ninety five perches
South sixty three degrees East fourteen perches to a bounded
White Oak thence North forty one degrees East sixteen perches
South forty degrees East thirty four perches to two bounded Ches-
nuts standing on the South West side of a hill thence North
twenty eight degrees East ninety two perches to the End of the
second line of a tract of Land called Miller's Point thence South
East fifty four perches South twenty four degrees and an half
East twelve perches to a bounded White Oak the beginning of
a tract of Land called Georges Interest thence South seventy nine
degrees West thirty two perches South thirty eight degrees West
sixty six perches to a bounded White Oak and a bounded Spa-
nish Oak thence South fifty two degrees West twenty seven
