Mem^o: The within Certificate is a correction of one returned in consequence of a warrant of resurvey dated the 22nd of January 1794 on part of Bealls Manor originally on the 20th of May 1720 granted Charles and William Beall for 1707 acres, part of Snowden's part^l addition to his manor, part of Mount Radnor originally on the 21st day of January 1706 granted Evan Thomas for 29 acres, part of Beaver Dam originally on the 6th day of August 1708 granted Evan Thomas for 60 acres, and here was afterwards on the 20th of December 1794 given to resurvey and include the following lands viz: part of Snowden's manor enlarged originally on the 10th of August 1753 granted Richard Snowden for 920 acres, and part of Saint Wencesburgh originally on the 11th of November 1737 granted Samuel Thomas for 193 acres, - which said original Certificate included 1143 3/4 acres and was fully Compounded on

John Lancaster his Certificate 100th 1800. State of Maryland. By virtue of a special warrant of resurvey granted out of the Land office the 29th day of May 1798 to John Lancaster of Charles County to resurvey a tract or parcel of Land called Neals Gift lying in the County aforesaid originally on the 21st day of November 1797 granted to John Lancaster & his wife for 62 1/2 acres to resurvey the aforesaid tract to correct and amend any errors committed in the original survey and to add any vacant land thereto contiguous &c. I hereby certify that I find the said John Lancaster seized wife of the whole of the said tract of Land called Neals Gift but does not choose to include the whole of the said tract in the present resurvey as one of the boundaries is disputed by James and Bennett Neal which makes a considerable difference in the location of said Land and the result of the Dispute being uncertain the said John Lancaster chooses to include a small part of the said tract in the resurvey only; I have therefore carefully resurveyed and laid out for and in the name of him the said John Lancaster a part of the said tract of Land called Neals Gift and find the same to contain twenty six acres one rood and twenty five perches to which I have added one hundred and twenty one acres three roods and twenty three perches of vacant Land and reduced the whole into one entire tract now called a part of Neals Gift Resurveyed and is bounded as follows.
