Ex: Mr Henry Guffie his patt. 124<sup>d</sup> of Frederick to Know ye that  
 Guffies Delight — Whereas Henry Guffie of Baltimore County  
 by his Humble Petition to our Agents for management of Land Affairs within  
 this Province did set forth that there was about the Quantity of one hundred  
 and twenty Acres of Vacant Land lying and being in the County aforesaid adjoining  
 Smiths Grove, and Middle Land partly cultivated by Weans whereof The petitioner  
 conceived the same could not be effected by a common Warrant therefore Humbly  
 prayed a Special Warrant to have effect to secure it and that on return of a  
 Certificate of such survey he complying with all other requisites usual in such  
 cases might have an Grant issued unto him thereon which was granted him And  
 Accordingly a Warrant on the twenty second Day of February seventeen  
 hundred and fifty nine unto him for that purpose directed, but the said Warrant  
 not being Executed within the time therein limited it was on the 5<sup>th</sup> Day of  
 February seventeen hundred and seventy one now and continued in force for six  
 Months longer from that Date, (with Liberty of executing the same on so  
 much Vacant Land lying and being in the County aforesaid and between The  
 Meadow, Johnsons chance, & Ashmores ~~Retirement~~ Retirement, Insurance  
 whereof it is certified into our Land Office that there was Surveyed and laid out for  
 and in the Name of him the said Henry Guffie the Quantity of one hundred and twenty  
 four Acres of Vacant Land, one hundred and twenty acres part thereof

rights was made good to at the time of granting said Warrant, and for the remaining  
 four Acres he has paid and satisfied unto John Morton Jordan Esquire our present  
 Agent and receiver General for our use the sum of one pound eighteen shillings  
 Sterling being as well for the caution of the said four Acres as for some improvements  
 mentioned to be made thereon, according to Charles Lord Baron of Baltimore  
 our Great Grand Father of Noble Memory his Instructions to Charles Carroll  
 Esquire his then Agent bearing Date at London the twelfth Day of December  
 seventeen hundred and twelve and registered in our Secretaries Office of our  
 said Province Together with a paragraph of our Dear Fathers Instructions  
 bearing Date at London the fifteenth Day of December seventeen hundred and  
 thirty eight and registered in our Land Office, We do therefore hereby Grant unto  
 him the said Henry Guffie all that Tract or parcel of Land called Guffies Delight  
 lying and being in the County aforesaid, Beginning at the end of the South seventy eight  
 Degrees West twelve perches from a Tract of Land surveyed for Stephen Onion  
 called Lee Hill Enlarged and being the seventeenth line of said Tract and running thence  
 North twenty four Degrees West fifty perches North fifty four Degrees East forty  
 four perches North twenty three ~~four~~ Degrees West fifty perches South sixty  
 Degrees West twelve perches North twenty four Degrees and fifteen minutes  
 West seventy three perches North thirty two Degrees East fifty seven perches  
 South fifty eight Degrees West one hundred and seventy four perches South thirty  
 two Degrees East four perches North fifty eight Degrees East fifty three perches  
 South fifty Degrees East fifty two perches South three degrees West fifty perches  
 South twenty two Degrees West thirty six perches South fifty two Degrees West  
 thirty two perches North forty eight perches North thirty two Degrees West forty

 Marys at the two most usual feasts in the year Viz. the feast of the annuncia  
 tion of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Michael the Archangel by con  
 and Equal Portions the rent of five Shillings Sterling in Silver or Gold and  
 for a fine upon every alienation of the said Land or any Part or parcel thereof

one whole year or in silver or Gold or the full Value thereof in such form made  
 this as we and our Heirs or such Officer Officers as shall be appointed by  
 us and our Heirs from time to time to collect and receive the same shall  
 accept in Discharge thereof at the choice of us and our Heirs or such  
 Officer or Officers aforesaid provided that if the said sum for a fine for

 ted by us or our Heirs from time to time to collect receive the same Given  
 under our Great Seal of our said Province of Maryland this eighth Day  
 of August anno Domini seventeen hundred and seventy one, Witness our  
 Brother Robert Eden Esquire Governor and Commander in Chief  
 and over our said Province of Maryland Chancellor and Keeper of the  
 Great Seal thereof

 Manninge Delight Michael Hoff of Baltimore County by  
 his humble petition to our Agents for management of Land affairs  
 within this Province did set forth that he had on the nineteenth of  
 August seventeen hundred and forty seven granted him by Patent under  
 the Great Seal of this Province tract or parcel of Land called Hickory  
 bottom lying and being in the County afo<sup>d</sup> and containing Ninety Acres under  
 New Rent contiguous to which tract the petitioner had discovered  
 some Vacant Land and being desirous to add the same humbly prayed  
 a special Warrant to Resurvey the aforesaid Tract for that intent  
 and purpose and that on the returne of a certificate of such Resurvey  
 he making good Right to the vacancy added and complying with  
 all other Requisites usual in such cases might have our Grant  
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
