





Peggy's Delight lying in Baltimore County aforesaid; Beginning at the end of the South West

Richard Griffiths Son Patent } The State of Maryland et. Knowe that Whereas  
 30 T. 1797. Honey Quarry } the Intendant of the Revenue was by Law vested with full  
 power and authority and was directed to sell and dispose of certain Manors in this State  
 In pursuance Whereof the said Intendant exposed the same to sale and a certain Richard  
 Griffiths senior became the purchaser of part of New Connaught Manors in Cecil County; and whereas  
 a Certificate of Survey of the said part hath been returned to the Western Shore Land Office containing  
 thirty six acres more or less and twelve perches called by the name of Honey Quarry and it appearing  
 by receipt and oved on the said Certificate that the purchase money hath been fully paid to  
 the Treasurer of the Western Shore The State of Maryland doth hereby Grant unto him the  
 said Richard Griffiths Son, the said tract or parcel of Land called Honey Quarry, lying in Cecil County  
 aforesaid, Beginning at a marked White Oak tree on a near the East Line of a tract of Land called  
 Glass house and running thence as a plot North sixteen and a half degrees East forty eight and three  
 quarters perches to a marked White Oak tree thence North twenty three degrees East twenty eight  
 and three quarters perches to a marked White Oak tree on the South side of a creek above  
 the edge thereof thence North sixty six and one half degrees East twenty two perches bounding on  
 said Creek thence South forty five and one half degrees East twenty three perches bounding on said Creek  
 thence South seventy degrees East twenty one perches bounding on said Creek thence North forty seven  
 one quarter degrees East sixteen perches to a marked Spanish Oak tree on the North side of said  
 Creek it being the beginning tree of a tract of Land belonging to James and John Rowland called  
 Friendship thence South one and a half degrees East twenty perches until it intersects the East line  
 of a tract of Land called Glass house thence with a straight line bounding on Glass house to  
 the beginning containing and laid out for thirty six acres and one quarter and twelve perches of  
 Land more or less, according to the Certificate of Survey thereof taken and returned into the Land
