teen between Isaac her of Hartford County and State of Maryland of one part and Joseph Stephens her  
of the same County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Isaac her for and in con-  
sideration of the sum of twelve hundred dollars current money of the United States to him in hand well  
and truly paid before the executing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Isaac her  
doth hereby acknowledge and from or by part thereof doth hereby upon oath acquit and discharge him the  
said Joseph Stephens her his heirs executors and administrators her the said Isaac her half gran-  
tee her grantee and aliened enfranchised released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant  
confer and confirm unto the said Joseph Stephens her and to his heirs and  
assigns, all that the following described tract or parcel of land composed of several pieces or por-  
tions of land in Hartford County on both sides of Broad Creek beginning at the place where the pub-  
lic road croseth the line of the meadow, by the side of Broad Creek and running with the  
road to John Walker's line, then bounding on said Walker's land until it comes to Lidgwick  
James' land then bounding on Lidgwick James' land to a stone set at the end of the second line  
of a tract of land called John's Beginning, then North forty five degrees East thirty perches  
and then to the South West corner of the young Orchard fence, and with said Orchard fence to  
the aforesaid public road, and with the road to a line of a tract of land called Orion's Meadow  
Ground then with that line North Eighty six degrees East to a hook or hutch then up the hook  
to the upper side of the new field, having two springs on the East side of the line or lines and  
then with the new field to the first line of a tract of land called Jeffrey's romantic Prospect  
and with the second line to the beginning of said tract then bounding on the first and part of the  
second line northerly until it intersects a fence then with that fence as it runs to a corner of  
land conveyed by said Isaac her to William Mc Coy, then with the lines as established between
