THIS DEED, made this 18th day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and fortysix, by and between D. PAUL MCNABB, unmarried, of Harford County, State of Maryland, party of the first part, and BALTIMORE AREA COUNCIL BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA, INCORPORATED, a corporation of the State of Maryland, party of the second part.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tracts or parcels of ground unto andto the use of the said Baltimore Area Council Boy Scouts of America, Incorporated, its successors and assigns, in fee simple. AND the said party of the first part covenants that he will warrant specially theproperty hereby granted and conveyed, and that he will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be requisite.
